## **Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ – 29<sup>th</sup> May 2016**

As they narrated the story of the Last Supper of Jesus with his disciples, the first generations of Christians would remember the solemnly expressed desire of the Master: *Do this in memory of me.* This is how Luke and Paul, the evangeliser of the gentiles, look back on it. Ever since it began, the supper of the Lord has been celebrated by Christians in memory of Jesus, to make this living presence a reality in our midst, and to nourish our faith in him, in his message and in his life given for us unto death. The thoughtful participation of the community highlights the meaning of these moments and the way to live them. *Listening to the gospel.* We remember Jesus when we listen to the story of his life and his message in the Gospels. They were written specifically to preserve the memory of Jesus and thus strengthen the faith and the will of his disciples to follow him. We do not infer any doctrine from the Gospel narrative but we learn, above all, that the way Jesus was and acted should be a model and inspiration for the way we live. So we must listen to it with the attitude of disciples who wish to learn, to think, feel, love and live like him. Sometimes when we are faced with people's needs and look at our own resources we can sit down in a state of depression, believing that we have nothing to give. The hunger of people is so vast and our abilities are so small. But all care and all ministry is a sharing from poverty. Not one of us has all the answers; not one of us is a millionaire in mercy and compassion. We are challenged to be the body of Christ. Jesus shared himself; he gave himself away; he became bread for all who hunger and thirst for the presence of God. The promise of the Gospel is that if we share our poverty then we too will inherit a kingdom prepared for us from the beginning of the world.

## MINUTES OF PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

St John Vianney, Halewood

**Tuesday 24<sup>th</sup> May 2016**

The meeting opened at 6pm with a prayer led by Fr. Vin.

**Present:** Geraldine Marsh (Acting Chair), Fr. Vin, Agnes Cannon, Carole Clancy, Peter Crompton, Jim Harrison, Jenny Jones, Chris Myles, Kami Lester

**Apologies:** Jan Cunningham

**Minutes of Previous Meeting:** accepted as true record

**Matters arising:** Chris Myles clarified issues re volunteers and payment for DBS re-checks. Volunteers can register their DBS online free of charge when they receive their certificate as long as they do it within the required time scale. The online re-check process does not eliminate the need for some paperwork.

### **Notification of Any Other**

**Business:** Toilets. Dementia Friends.

**Correspondence:** a letter from Ron Smith to Fr Vin was read to the Council. Ron has now resigned as Chair of the Parish Council. The Council expressed their thanks for his work and agreed that the Acting Chair should send a letter to Ron.

**Review of Easter liturgies:** There had been very positive comments re the various liturgical events. The choir was commended for their excellent contribution. The absence of the hymn supplement for Easter was disappointing as it restricted the diversity of hymns. The two Reconciliation events went well. There does not seem to be an issue for those involved in running two events in one day. The Council recommended that the Ladies Group considers running similar events for Easter 2017. The children's Good Friday liturgy was not as well attended as in previous years.

**New Parish priest/Parish development update:** Fr. Matthew Nunes who is to take over as Parish priest in September has visited Fr. Vin to begin to get to know the parish. The Council was reminded that Fr Matthew will have the dual role of parish priest here and Episcopal Vicar for Formation at LACE. Fr Matthew had holidays booked prior to the decision for his move. Consequently, supply priests will cover the interval between Fr. Vin leaving at the end of August and Fr. Matthew arriving in the last week of September. Finalisation of development plans for the parish have been put on hold to allow Fr. Matthew time to consider the proposals for re-ordering of the church buildings. Jon Lester has prepared a presentation on church re-ordering which he will present to Fr Matthew initially and then to the parish. Fr. Matthew is to meet with the 3 head teachers imminently and will attend the next meeting of the Parish Council on 19<sup>th</sup> July.

**Vianney's Voice:** Attendance for the Fashion Show was disappointing. Many had bought tickets, but did not attend. Consequently, the deposit for the event was lost. Despite this, a healthy £300 was raised and £127 in donations was received. A meeting is to be held on Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> May to plan an inter-parish sports event. It was confirmed that 5 young people from the parish will be taking part in the Lourdes pilgrimage this year.

**With You Always/Tots:** Seventy-four children received the sacraments of Holy Communion and Confirmation on Saturday 21<sup>st</sup> May. Arrangements have been made for 2 children who were unable to attend the event. One will receive the sacraments on 5<sup>th</sup> June while the other will receive Holy Communion on 17<sup>th</sup> July, but is outside the time limit to receive Confirmation this year. A new system with accompanying resources is to be introduced for next year. Consequently, at present, it is not possible to confirm dates for 2017. The first enrolment event is likely to take place in late September.

Tots is going very well with about 20 children connected with the group and 8-10 attending regularly.

**Schools:** all schools are celebrating their Year 4 children who received the sacraments of Holy Communion and Confirmation recently. Fr Vin has continued to celebrate class masses; by the time he leaves us all children in Years 4-6 will have joined in these masses. The next 3 Schools Mass will be celebrated on

Monday 18<sup>th</sup> July in St. Mark's school.

**Baptism:** Three families attended the Annual Baptism celebration Mass. It went well and very positive comments were expressed. It was agreed that this works best when held on a Sunday afternoon. The Council expressed their thanks to the Ladies' Group for their work in organising the event. The newly introduced process of ordering of Baptism preparation events is not working well. It was agreed to return to the original system.

**RCIA:** three adults went through RCIA preparation. Many have attended parish events enthusiastically. The Archbishop held an event at the Cathedral for those newly received into the church. Attendance was not good, but those who did attend felt it was a very positive experience.

**Health & Safety Committee:** Jim Harrison presented draft versions of a guide that he has produced on Health and Safety Rules for Parish Workers. This is based on the Archdiocesan Health and Safety manual. It was reported that a Fire Alarm had been activated accidentally at 5:15pm Mass at Holy Family church on Sunday 22<sup>nd</sup> May. There were concerns at the poor response from parishioners who remained talking in church. It was agreed that unless told otherwise any sounding of the fire alarm should be treated as a real incident.

**Safeguarding:** The annual Children's Mass will be held on Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> July. This year Fr Grant

and our Pastoral Area will be organising it. Catechists will be needed to assist with this. Fr. Vin and Chris Myles had attended the first module on a Safeguarding course and Chris has now followed this up by attending 2 further modules, one on Protecting the Young and Vulnerable and the other on Creating a Suitable Environment. Parishes have been encouraged to set up a process whereby Eucharistic Ministers report that they have arrived back safely from visiting parishioners. Chris Myles explained the process of those involved in parish ministries undertaking the Educare online training. This should be completed within 3 months of new ministers taking up their role. Fr Matthew is to meet with all involved in parish ministries to discuss Educare training.

**Ladies' Group:** money has been set aside to establish a Calvary to commemorate the former St. Andrew's parish. A Barn Dance/Ceilidh is to be held on Friday 17<sup>th</sup> June at St. Mark's club.

#### **Any Other Business:**

Toilets: it was agreed that parishioners should be reminded that any children using church toilets **must** be accompanied by an adult. Adults using toilets **must** lock the toilet door.

Dementia Friends: Fr. Vin and Geraldine Marsh had attended the recent Dementia Friends event and had found it interesting and enlightening. People can enrol at different levels according to the



amount of time that they can commit. Five aspects of dementia were read out:

- It's not a natural part of ageing
- It's caused by diseases of the brain
- It's not just about losing your memory – it can affect thinking, communicating and doing everyday tasks
- It's possible to live well with dementia
- There's more to a person than the dementia

With support, people with dementia can and do take an active role in life.

The meeting closed with a prayer at 19:20 pm.

### **Monthly Devotions of the Church Year**

Each month of the year is dedicated to a particular devotion within the Catholic faith; the dedication of each month is based on historical events or a particular aspect of the liturgical calendar, or a combination of the two. These monthly Catholic devotions do not line up exactly with the time frame of the liturgical calendar, since they are fixed to standard calendar months rather than the Church seasons. Some

countries and areas have developed monthly dedications to devotions more specific to their area, but the following are the common, widespread Catholic devotions for each month throughout the year.

**January Devotion:** January is the month of the Holy Name of Jesus. The feast of the Holy Name originated in the 1500s and was formerly celebrated on the second Sunday of Epiphany. The official litany of the Holy Name of Jesus is included in the book [A Prayerbook of Favorite Litanies](#). Because of the feasts in January which pertain to Christ's infancy and childhood, January has also become a month dedicated to the Holy Childhood of Jesus.

**February Devotion:** February is the month dedicated to the Holy Family. Though the start of the Lenten season changes within the calendar year, a fair-sized portion of February gives us a space of time between the Christmas celebrations and the increased focus on Jesus's public life and ministry, which occurs in Lent.

**March Devotion:** March is the month of devotion to St. Joseph, whose feast falls on March 19<sup>th</sup>. The date of the solemnity of St. Joseph dates to the end of the 15<sup>th</sup> century; within the next few centuries, the entire month as a time for devotion to St. Joseph became part of tradition.

**April Devotion:** The month of April is dedicated both to devotion to the Eucharist and devotion to the Holy Spirit. This tradition has developed because Easter Sunday often falls in April, and when it does fall in March,

the Easter season continues on through all of April. In essence, April is a month of Easter, and during the Easter celebration we remember the Eucharistic sacrifice Christ gave us and the baptism in the Holy Spirit, which would come after Jesus's resurrection.

**May Devotion:** May is the month of Mary; devotion to the Blessed Mother throughout May originated in Rome in the 18<sup>th</sup> century to counter immorality and infidelity among students at a college there. It has spread through most of the Latin Church now. Because the North American holiday of Mother's Day falls in May, Catholics take this time to recall and try to emulate Mary's role as mother. Therefore, devotion to Mary in the month of May focuses both on Mary as a role model for Christian mothers, and Mary's everlasting chastity and purity, and her fidelity to God's will.

**June Devotion:** June is the month of the Sacred Heart. A devotion long practiced privately, it was officially approved in the 1800s. Devotion to the Sacred Heart encourages participation in Holy Hour Eucharistic Adoration and to receive Holy Communion on the first Friday of every month.

**July Devotion:** July is the month dedicated to the Precious Blood of Our Lord; the Feast of the Precious Blood is the first Sunday of the month.

**August Devotion:** The month of August is dedicated to the Blessed Sacrament, and increased adoration of the Eucharist is encouraged. August is also dedicated to the

Immaculate Heart of Mary, and on August 15<sup>th</sup>, the church celebrates the Assumption of Mary into heaven.

**September Devotion:** September is traditionally dedicated to the Seven Sorrows (or *Dolours*) of Mary, and the Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows falls in September. The Sorrows are: the prophecy of Simeon, the flight into Egypt, the loss of the Holy Child at Jerusalem for three days, meeting Jesus on his way to Calvary, standing at the foot of the Cross, Jesus being taken from the Cross, and the burial of Christ.

**October Devotion:** October is the month of the Rosary, because of the anniversary of victory at the Battle of Lepanto and the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary occurring in October. The Battle of Lepanto and the institution of the feast day took place in the 17<sup>th</sup> century; in the late 1800s, Pope Leo XIII officially dedicated the entire month to devotion to the Holy Rosary

**November Devotion:** The month of November is dedicated to the poor souls in purgatory. All souls day falls on November 2<sup>nd</sup>, which is when we commemorate all the faithful departed.

**December Devotion:** December is dedicated to Advent and the coming of Christ. This refers to the preparation for the celebration of remembering Christ's birth 2000 years ago, but also the prayerful, spiritual preparation for the second and final coming of the Lord.- This article incorporated some information from the [Catholic Encyclopedia](#).
